Project Updates

- Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) RCT: THETA's first field evaluation is underway. The DBS protocol has been submitted to the Research Ethics Board at UHN. The Case Report Form is being designed in collaboration with Progressare, the company providing a digitalized solution for data capture. Participant recruitment will hopefully begin in May. In addition to THETA staff, this project involves site investigators, Dr's Andres Lozano and Sid Kennedy, and THETA investigators, Dr. David Urbach and Shabbir Alibhai.
- Systematic Review of the Cost Effectiveness of Biologics for Rheumatoid Arthritis: In close collaboration with Dr. Bombardier and staff from the Medical Advisory Secretariat (MAS) at the MoH, THETA led the writing of a report that has been presented to the CED. It is currently under review within CED.
- Pressure Ulcer Project (PU): A comprehensive policy model is being developed with Drs. Bayoumi, Wodchis and Krahn. Input data is from a plethora of sources including a review of the literature, consultation with clinical experts, and from administration databases from the MoH. The model will be used to generate a "league" table displaying clinical effectiveness, cost, cost-effectiveness and budget impact analysis for a large number of prevention and treatment options.

More detailed project descriptions and updates will be shared at the THETA retreat.
